# Laurier Will Finish His Work

## LIBERALS GO BACK TO POWER WITH MAJORITY OF FORTY-EIGHT BUT ONE MINSTER DEFEATED

The Government Ahead in Quebec, Nova Scotia New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, Saskatchewan and Alberta---Liberals Make Remarkable Run In Ontario.

After one of the hardest-fought political campaigns Canada has ever witnessed, the Government of Sir Wilfrid Laurier has been sustained by a majority which, when all the returns are in, will be nearly 50.

In the face of a campaign which onsisted almost wholly of misrepresentation and scandal cries, the Government fought hard and strong, coming out of the conflict with flying colors. The abnormal majority of 1904 is reduced somewhat, but not sufficiently to damage the Government's prestige.

In Ontario.

Ontario was the great battle-ground of the campaign. The Conservative leaders fondly hoped that with the backing of the Whitney administration, and the prestige of the victory in June last, they would sweep Ontario, and this means offset Quebec. It was thought that British Columbia would send a delegation of Conservatives, and that Roblin would deliver Manitoba intact to Mr. oBrden. It hoped that Mr. Bon would hold the east to a even break at least.

As a result Ontario was treated as bitter and venomous a campaign a could possibly be contrived. The Prov ince was thoroughly soaked with scan dal. it was thought by the Conservative speakers, and they looked with confidence to polling day. The expected slump failed to come off, and instead of a sweep for the Conservatives, the Liberals more than held

In Quebec.

In Quebec the result was a foregon conclusion. The Conservatives mad little or no headway. The parties stand practically as they did in 1904. In the east the Government lost little, and they lost also in the west Manitoba gave a majority for the Op- Dru position, and so did British Columbia. Alberta and Saskatchewan remained with the Government. Not a single minister is among the

missing, except Mr. Templeman, of Kan Mr. W. L. Mackenzie King, who will be minister of labor in the Government, had a notable triumph in North Waterloo, Sir Wilfrid himself was elected for two constituencies, Ottawa and Quebec.

A number of Conservative leaders

are numbered among the missing, including Fowler, Lefurgey, Bennett, Man Pope, Cockshutt and others. Mr. R. L. Borden, however, scored a Mis victory, winning his old riding of Hal- Mor


