CLEAN BILL OF HEALTH

Says E. T. Essery, of London, in Support of New Insurance

Toronto, April 26 .- "This bill will turn fraternal societies into life insurance ompanies," declared Mr. P. M. Pattison, Toronto, at the annual meeting of the Canadian Fraternal Association yesterday. He was discussing the bill introduced by Mr. J. A. Patterson, K. C., chairman of a special drafting committee, to regulate fraternal benefit societies, and he added that proposals like this were making every fraternal society un-

An explanation had just been made by Mr. Paterson. He said the bill proposed that every three years each society should report to the registrar of insurance a valuation of its assets and abilities and send a copy to every member. If the registrar was not satisfied that the return of valuation shows that he society is actuarially sound he will order it to improve its deficiency of 5 per cent every three years, so that in 60 ears all societies would be actuarially olvent. There was nothing to prevent society improving itself faster if it ished, but if it did not advance at the rate of 5 per cent every three years the registrar could cancel its registration. It vas not a rate bill compelling every soiety to come to a uniform rate, but alwing societies to improve at their own

simply purposes that societies should show a clean bill of health every three years," said Mr. E. T. Essery, London, who agreed that public opinion demanded such a measure, and if the societies did not originate it Parliament would force a bill on them. "Surely it is better to undertake an own reform and have 60 years in which to finish it, than have Parliament tell us to do it in much less time," was the sum of Essery's argu-
