M. SBARETTI REFUSES TO ANSWER QUESTIONS

Montreal, Oct. 29.—After much dickered before the civil courts of this province, it seems that the case of C. S. Edwards vs. the Seminary of Sainte Marie du Monnoir and M. Sbarretti is about to enter into an altogether new phase and become a diplomatic affair.
