

A BATCH OF SENTENCES

In the Assize Court yesterday the Grand Jury made its pronouncement. The documents set forth that many petty Police Court indictments had to be passed over owing to the absence of the Police Magistrate. The jury expressed its opinion that three-fourths of the petty larceny and assault committed can be traced to the use of intoxicating drinks. The jury condemned the condition of the Court House, adding that the Police Court building was even worse. The jury spoke favorably of the Central Prison, the Jail, the Mercer Reformatory and the Asylum. They recommended that grand jurors be paid \$2.50 per day that the Government should be called upon to legislate as to admit of prisoners being allowed out on parole, and in conclusion recorded its regret at the death of Sheriff Jarvis and Chief Justice Cameron.

Mr. Justice Ross alluded to the different points touched by the grand jury. Referring to the state of the Court House, he described it as insanitary, and said that the atmosphere in the judge's chamber was as pestiferous as any that could be manufactured without the aid of distillation. "I am not satisfied," said His Lordship, "that the ill-health and weakness of the late Chief Justice was not due to the unsanitary condition of this building." Having paid a high tribute to the work of the late Chief Justice, His Lordship complained that the judicial staff of Ontario was insufficient to deal with the business, and that unless it be increased public business must necessarily get into arrears.

The grand jury was then discharged. His Lordship passed sentence on the convicted prisoners. John R. Hopkins and Oscar Hopkins, convicted of larceny of \$200.00, were sent to the Penitentiary for ten years. Two months in the Central Prison and fifty lashes, was the sentence passed upon John Grelling for indecently assaulting a girl of 12 years of age. For forgery, A. H. Moffatt got two years, less one day, in the Central Prison. John Sheehy was sent to the same establishment for six months, for an assault on David Little. A like term was meted by the court to William Davey for felonious wounding, and to Thos. McLaughlin for larceny. William Blair was sent to Kingston for five years for larceny, as which he is an old hand. James Leathers, a youthful Dick Turpin, was sent to the Penitentiary for five years. In sentencing this prisoner His Lordship said he was determined to show the rogues of the city that they should be dealt with whenever convicted before him. The public indignation at the case of Grelling was by night as by day, and the citizens should be kept from fear and terror of their lives. Michael Leathers, who aided Leathers in his highway robbery, was set off with two years, less a day.

Wm. Lene and James McGrath were charged with robbing and assaulting a man named Patrick Murray, a conductor on the C.T.R. Money was taken from Murray, silver watch. Peter Kelly was found guilty of having received, knowing them to have been stolen, 4000 cigars, the property of John Grelling, or same carried on margin by him. A charge of assault preferred against George Wilko, was dismissed. Martin Lobb, who was charged some time ago with being connected with three other men in the robbery of \$175 from a Frenchman named David St. Clair, entered court and announced that he was ready to stand his trial. A jury was sworn in the case, but as no witnesses for the prosecution were forthcoming, the men were discharged.
