THE BALLOTS NOW BEING PRINTED.

Preparations Already Being Made for the Approaching General Elections—A New Style of Ballot Suggested.

Ald. McGuire, McLean, Jamieson, and Messrs. W. Scott, John Lyons, Walter Soper, all of the city of Ottawa, visited upon the Government last evening to urge the adoption of a new style of ballot, invented and patented by ex-Mayor Durocher of Ottawa.

The names of candidates on the ballot submitted were printed on a brown ground, small white slits being left opposite each candidate's name, in the centre of which the voter makes his cross. This ballot was used in the Ottawa city elections last January and proved satisfactory in the highest degree.

Ald. McLean explained the object of their interview to the Premier, and remarked that they understood that the printing of the ballots was already in the hands of the printer. He thought it could be said that the Dominion Government would not be found very useful generally in municipal elections.
