#### Finland's New Flag.

The Russian revolution will probably result in lengthening the list of the world's flags by several additions. Finland, which, since March, has ceased to be a grand duchy and has declared her independence and status as a ro public, has now decided on her national She will have three different colors. standards: the national flag, the flag of the merchant service, and that of the pilot and customs services. The national colors are those which were acclaimed at the time of the revolution, the yellow lion of Finland surrounded by nine white roses on a red ground. The flag of the merchant service will have a yellow perpendicu-lar cross on a red ground and in the top right-hand corner, nine white roses set symmetrically in three rows. The pilot and customs services flag will be the same, except that it will carry the vellow of Finland instead of the white roses.

#### Fought With Owl.

### Aged Tree Is Dying.

The original navel orange tree, planted 44 years ago, producer of the first navel oranges grown in the United States and parent of millions of trees now growing in California, is believed to be dying. Horticultural experts have begun efforts to diagnose the disease that threatens it in the hope of prolonging its life.

This tree, the most noted in the cit-rus industry of California, came orig-inally from Bahia, Brazil. It was planted in 1873 by Mrs. C. L. Tibbetts, who obtained it from the botanical gar-dens in Washington, D. C.
