As Syria is one of the countries for which prayer is being offered this mouth, the following extract from an address by Rev. Geo. A. Ford of Syria, made at a missionary meeting held at Saratoga, N. Y., during the sessions of the American Presby terian General Assembly this year, and reported in the Church at Hone and Abroad, will be read with interest:—

What are the salient characteristics and points of this Syrian people? They are high in the scale of unevangelized peoples.
