Doing this will avoid a lot of trouble. Decisions in spiritual affairs belong where the constitution has placed them. Leave them there. Let no branch tolerate a member who will endeavor to correct the Spiritual Adviser by resolution, or otherwise, in branch meetings.

This Association cannot afford to have a single priest against it. From a business point of view, it could better afford to lose a dezen members, than forfeit the approbation of one priest. There is no reason for either, however; the constitution provides for all difficulties which may arise, if it would only be followed.
