TRIAL FOR HERESY.—The trial of the Rev. Oliver S. Prescott, recently of the Protestant Episcopal Church in Green street, Boston, was recommenced de novo last week, in the vestry of Trinity Church, Summer street. The principal charges are that he has keretically preached that the Virgin Mary may be lawfully worshipped by Christians; that auricular confession to the priest is proper, allowable, and profitable, and that the priest may grant absolution to the confessing penitent. G. M. Browne, Esq., is counsel for the standing committee, who have presented the charges, and R. H. Dana, Jr., Esq., is counsel for the respondent. -Boston Post.

The police had a desperate fight with the burglars, during which many severe wounds were received by the officers. Nearly the whole of the property was recovered.

At New Orleans, the week ending June 23d, there were 149 deaths by cholera, an increase of 26 over the week previous. The newly arrived emigrants are the chief sufferers.

A young man named Williams, who had eloped with the daughter of R. G. Morris, of Amherst, Va., was altacked by the brother of the girl, and others, in Nelson county. Revolvers were freely used by the parties, and Morris and Hill were instantly killed. The brother of Williams was also mortally wounded. -Boston Pilot.

A great will case has been decided in Virginia recently, which had been some time before the courts at Richmond, and by which eighty or ninety slaves are liberated. The heirs of the testator tried to break his will; but in the midst of one of the largest slaveholding communities in the world, they were defeated, and the slaves made free; and that too, at the hands of a jury composed entirely of slaveholders! What will the abolitionists and free-soilers say now?

California dates to the 1st of June have been received since our last issue. San Francisco and Stockton had been built up again, and business had become active. The news from the gold mines, continued favorable, and the usual quantities of gold were forwarded to the Atlantic cities by every steamer. Three millions and a half had arrived at Panama.-The John Calvin, from the penal colony of New South Wales, arrived on the 30th May, with 181 passengers, many of whom were convicts. There had been a serious riot at Nevada city.—Bos'on Pilot.
Philadelphia, July 7.—Some two hundred thousand

dollars in counterfeit coin was found upon the premises of a man named Stiller, living in the vicinity of 30th and Willow streets. Stiller was arrested in Baltimore and brought to this city. He will have a hearing on Wednesday, before the U.S. Conrt. The coin was well executed and extensively circulated.—American
