

EXCHANGE OF NOTES (APRIL 28 AND MAY 1st, 1951) BETWEEN CANADA AND
ICAO RELATING TO THE AGREEMENT

OTTAWA, April 28, 1951.

SIR,

I have the honour to refer to the Headquarters Agreement between the International Civil Aviation Organization and the Government of Canada signed in Montreal on April 14, 1951. The Government of Canada, in accordance with the provision of Section 41 thereof, proposes that this Note and your reply will bring this Agreement into force on May 1, 1951.

The interim arrangements set forth in the letter of April 30, 1947 of Mr. St. Laurent, who was then Secretary of State for External Affairs, by which privileges, immunities and facilities were extended to the International Civil Aviation Organization on a *de facto* basis, are to be regarded as superseded by the present Agreement.
