A separate programme is planned for the ladies accompanying he Japanese Delegation, with Mrs. Mitchell Sharp accompanying them on n informal trip to Montreal on Wednesday, and Mrs. Walter Gordon oining them for a visit to Upper Canada Village on Thursday. Mrs. shiba will give a dinner on Wednesday evening.

The meetings will conclude with the issuing of a final communiqué, and a press conference to be held in Room 208 of the West lock at 5.00 p.m. Thursday, September 26.

Following the Ministerial Committee meeting, a number of the apanese participants, including Mr. Akagi and Mr. Fukuda, will visit oronto and the Niagara Peninsula on Friday, September 27. They will epart from Uplands Airport by D.O.T. Viscount at 9.30 a.m., and lying by way of the St. Lawrence Seaway, will arrive at Toronto's alton Airport at 11.15 a.m. They will be guests at a luncheon given for them by Premier John Robarts in Toronto. In the afternoon the roup will travel by car to Niagara Falls, visiting as well Niagara wdro developments and the Welland Canal, and that evening will be uests at a dinner offered in their honour by the Honourable Udy LaMarsh, Minister of National Health and Welfare, at the city of Niagara Falls.

The Canada-Japan Ministerial Committee was established during the visit to Ottawa of the Prime Minister of Japan in June 1961 when it has agreed by the Canadian and Japanese Prime Ministers that, in view of the increasing importance of Canadian-Japanese relations, Ministers of the two Governments should meet from time to time to exchange views in matters of common interest, particularly in the economic field, and to familiarize themselves with the problems of the other country. The Ministerial Committee was not intended to be a negotiating body.
