NATIONAL COMMITTEE FOR THE TRAINING OF TEACHERS . CENTRAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE. Excerpt from Minutes of Central Executive Committee of 4th June 1926. 3. Amendment of Conditions affecting Student-Teacherships. The Committee then took up consideration of the conditions under which the student-teacherships should be held in future, and there was submitted a letter of 6th April from Colonel Bovey, M'Gill University, containing suggestions for a modification of the original conditions. After discussion it was agreed to recommend that No. 2(a), 3(a) of the Conditions (Minutes, Vol. V., p. 143) should be amended by the addition of the words in italics, so as to read as follows:-(3) That the selected candidates— (a) Follow at the American or Canadian University a course of study in some aspect of Education or in some subject in its educational aspect, according to the University's approved Scheme in the Faculty of Graduates' Study and Research, extending over one full session. It was also agreed to recommend that further negotiations be entered into with Teachers College, University of Columbia, and M'Gill University, with a view to the following emendations of the present conditions for American or Canadian nominations:-(1) That No. 2(b)(1) (Minutes, Vol. V., p. 143) be amended by the addition of the words in italics to read as follows:-That the candidates receive nominations from their respective Universities and have, in addition to professional training as teachers, an Honours Degree or its equivalent, and be desirous of continuing a course of study primarily relating to the Theory and Practice of the subject of Education at a Scottish University and Training Centre. (2) That No. 2 (b) (3) be amended to read as follows:— That they undertake to utilise the facilities of the University to which they may be attached, with a view to the advancement of any subject cr subjects of higher study on which they may be engaged.
