Dear Professor Snell,

On my return from New York this morning I found awaiting me your letter of November 15th. Please inform Dr. Cameron that his appointment was Professor of Parasitology, McGill University, and Director of the Institute of Parasitology at Macdonald College. By this fact he is a member of the Faculty of Agriculture at Macdonald College, and will also, I take it, be asked to sit as a member of the Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research. However, this latter fact must be taken up in formal fashion by the Faculty of Graduate Studies.

I have not made a final decision with regard to the Department of Animal Husbandry. Dean Barton assured me that he had made clear to both Professor Ness and Professor Crampton what their duties would be until the matter was finally settled. What I would suggest to you would be to ask both Ness and Crampton to attend Faculty meetings until farther notice. I shall try to get out shortly.
