

ceipt shall in all cases be a sufficient discharge; and he shall deposit with the Bank all such monies as he shall have on hand, when they amount to £25 0 0. He shall attend all meetings of the Directors or members of the Society: enter minutes of all resolutions or proceedings in the minute book, and shall keep the accounts in order,—in proper books to be provided for that purpose,—and prepare the same, or a balance sheet thereof, for the inspection and signature of the Auditors. He shall summon the Directors to all meetings, (by circular,) and issue all circulars and notices to members which may, from time to time, be thought necessary by the Directors: conduct the correspondence of the Society, and perform all other duties that the nature of the office may require, and before entering on his office shall furnish security as by the Statute provided.

He shall furnish security.

How monies to be drawn from Bank.

21. No monies shall be drawn from the Bank, without the signature of the President or Vice-President, (or in the absence of both, of any two Directors) and of the Treasurer.

Minute Book to be kept.

22. The proceedings of the Society shall be entered in a minute book, in detail, in such manner as the Directors may, from time to time, direct; such entries to be signed by the President, Vice-President, or Chairman, as well as by the Secretary and Treasurer.

Society's rules to be subscribed by Shareholders.

23. The Rules of the Society shall be copied into a book provided for that purpose, and shall be subscribed by the Shareholders, and the name and place of abode of each Shareholder shall be entered in a registry book to be kept for that purpose.

Change of residence to be notified.

Any Member changing his residence shall, within one calendar month thereafter, give notice, in writing, to the Secretary, of such change, and of his new place of abode and address, or in default thereof be fined 2s. 6d.

Surveyors to be appointed—Their duties &c.

24. One or more Surveyors shall be appointed, who shall survey and examine the property offered by any member of the Society, if the Directors shall consider it necessary, and shall, in all cases, render at the Society's office, a report in writing, to the Directors, of the value and state of such property, in such form as the Directors shall prescribe, and who shall be paid such fees as the Directors shall think reasonable.
