Liquor Laws, Equal Suffrage and other Saskatchewan Legislation Affecting Women

1. SALES OF LIQUOR ACT. Paragraphs 1-11. Page 4
Gives information for voters regarding the referendum on liquor stores to be held December 11, 1916.
2. THE CHILDREN'S PROTECTION ACT. Paragraphs 12-17. Page 7
Explains the Act and gives a summary of the work of Superintendent of Neglected and Dependent Children.
3. MEDICAL SERVICES AND HOSPITALS. Paragraphs 18-21. Page 9
Includes an outline of what has been done to enable the people of Saskatchewan to have medical services and hospital accommodation.
4. THE HOMESTEAD ACT. Paragraphs 22-26. Page 10
"Homestead" means the place where the home is and may be the quarter section homesteaded, or the home in city, town or village. A wife may prevent the mortgaging, sale or transfer of her husband's homestead.
5. THE DEVOLUTION OF ESTATES ACT. Paragraph 27. Page 12
This deals with the distribution of property left by persons who die without having made a will. A wife who has not been left at least one-third of her husband's estate may obtain relief under this Act.
6. DESERTED WIVES MAINTENANCE ACT. Paragraphs 28-29. Page 12
Provides means of relief to women who have been deserted by their husbands.
7. THE FACTORIES ACT. Paragraph 30. Page 12
The protection to women employees in factories is briefly outlined.
8. EMPLOYMENT OF WHITE GIRLS OR WOMEN BY CHINAMEN. Paragraph 31. Page 13
Gives the main provisions of the Act.
9. THE SASKATCHEWAN ELECTIONS ACT. Paragraphs 31-51. Page 13
The provisions of the Election Act which permits women to vote in Provincial elections and to be candidates in an election of members to the Legislature are given under this section.
10. THE VOTE IN MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS. Paragraphs 52-57. Page 19
The status of women as voters in municipal and school matters is given under this heading, with details regarding (a) rural municipalities, (b) villages, and (c) cities and towns.
