MILLER GOES TO COUNTY JAIL OPPOSITION GIVING UP FIGHT AFTER HOURS OF WRANGLING

Government Released From Uncomfortable Predicament by Unexpected Capitulation of Sir Wilfrid - Prisoner Disclosed New Points in Defence, But Premier Declined to Have Issue Clouded.

OTTAWA, Friday, Feb. 21.—(Special.)—At an early hour this morning it was announced that counsel for Mr. Miller had applied for a writ of habeas corpus, which would be issued tomorrow morning and made returnable forthwith, directed to the sheriff of Carleton County, demanding him to bring Miller into court.

OTTAWA, Feb. 20.—(Special.)—Unstable as water, the opposition, after apparently putting the government into an awkward situation this afternoon, completely collapsed tonight and did not even divide the house upon the Miller contempt case.

His justification or defence rested upon several grounds. One of these was that the matter in controversy was at present a subject of litigation in the City of Montreal. It was also contended that the question put to Miller in the house had never been asked him in the public accounts committee, that he was cited to appear at the bar of the house. The further claim was made that the question put to Miller contained an assumption that he had sworn to certain statements before the public accounts committee when as a matter of fact he had given no such testimony.

MADERO'S FATE IN BALANCE AMID PLAUDITS OF PUBLIC

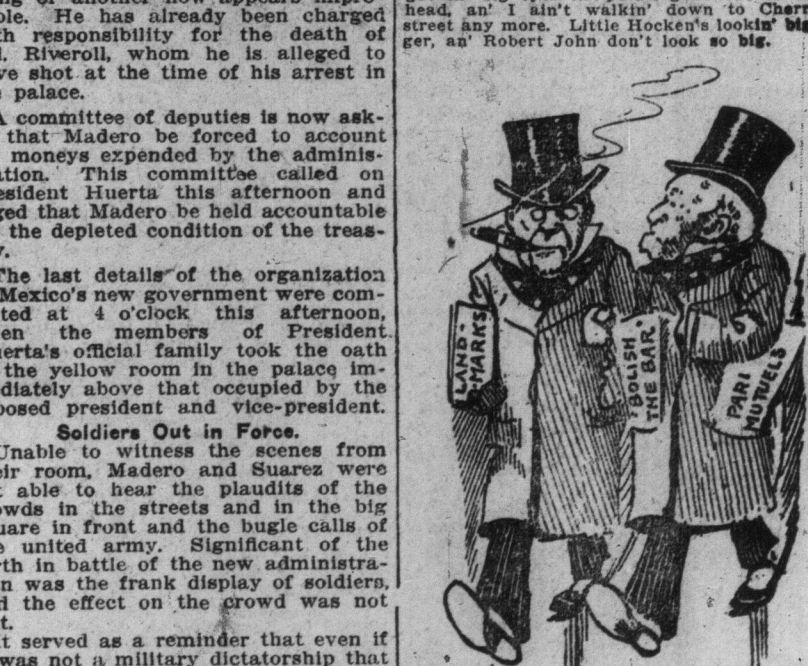
