

THE SENATE OF CANADA.

BILL V3.

An Act respecting The Casualty Company of Canada.

WHEREAS a petition has been presented praying that it be enacted as hereinafter set forth and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition: Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:

Preamble. 1911, c. 63.

1. Notwithstanding anything in section 78 of The Insurance Act, 1910, or in the Act, chapter 63 of the statutes of 1911, incorporating The Casualty Company of Canada, the said chapter shall be deemed not to have expired and ceased to be in force after the nineteenth day of May, 1913, but to have continued and to be in force, for all purposes thereof whatsoever, until the nineteenth day of May, 1914; and the Minister of Finance may, at any time not later than the nineteenth day of May, 1914, and subject to all other provisions of The Insurance Act, 1910, grant to that company the license necessary for carrying on business.

Extension of time for obtaining license. 1910, c. 32, s. 78.

2. If the company has not obtained the said license by the nineteenth day of May, 1914, the said chapter shall then expire and cease to be in force thereafter, except for the sole purpose of winding up the company's business, but otherwise shall remain in full force and effect for all purposes thereof whatsoever.
