called Surprise. The Company's property begins on the farther shore of the Cheewhat, where one strikes at once the splendid sand beach. The trees, mostly conifers, include excellent examples of spruce, hemlock, cedar, some balsam, and, inland a few miles, there are fir and pine.

For almost the entire length of the Company's property, the ground rises high, at times approaching to the height of cliffs, from 100 to 150 yards back from the beach. This gives a wonderful opportunity for sweeping views of the water and adds a picturesqueness to the character of the property that greatly increases its charm.
