fronting us for solution, I think my past course should cause me to be believed when I say, I should be the last to revive old issues; but when we find a pseudo-Methodist Episcopacy flaunted in our faces, and we ourselves tolerantly treated as erring "seceders," it is a little tough that we have to fraternize and tacitly endorse these pretenders in the largest court of Methodism on the continent.

My own final opinion now is, that if the American General Conference cannot induce their *proteges* to conduct themselves with decency; if we must listen to the diatribes of "Bishop" Carman in this country, and then meet him and endorse him by our representatives there, if we hold fraternal relations with that great division of Methodism at all, then I say, we had *better forego the honor altogether*. If these circumstances continue, I DELIBERATELY GIVE IT AS MY HUMBLE OPINION, THAT WE SHALL CONSULT OUR DIGNITY BEST BY SENDING NO DELEGATES TO THE GENE-RAL CONFERENCE OF THE METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH.
