SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

A NY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatenewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain contert, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of he land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres solely owned mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homestead in land occupied by him or by als father, and certain districts a homestead in land occupied by him or by als father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

in certain districts a homest-ader in good standing may pre-empt quarter-section alongside his homest-ad. Price 53.00 per acre. Dutles—Mest reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price 52.00 per acre. Dutles—Must reside six months in each of three-years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth 5300.00.
