## LABOR MAN MAY OPPOSE HENDRIE IN W. HAMILTON

South Wentworth May Also Be Tempted—Fight in E. Hamilton Between Studholme and Cooper.

HAMILTON, Nov. 12.—(Special.)—The executive committee of the Independent Labor party, will hold another meeting in Labor Hall, Monday night, to consider the question of placing a candidate in the West Hamilton riding for the provincial legislature. It has practically been decided to contest the riding, and H. J. Halford, a barber, and an aggressive laborite, is looked upon as the man most likely to be chosen to make the fight. It is said, however, that there are half a dozen others who would like to try conclusions with Col. Hendrie, and it is uncertain who will be selected.

It is also probable that the labor party will put a candidate in the South Wentworth riding, if that part of Ward 8, which is now in the county constituency, is allowed to remain as it is. This district, which is known as Crown Point, contains a heavy labor vote.

**An Interesting Contest.**  
The fight for the honor of representing the East Hamilton constituency in the provincial legislature promises to be one of the most interesting political contests ever seen in this city. It is not known yet whether or not the Liberals will make an effort to capture the riding, but it is the general opinion that their action either one way or the other will not affect the outcome to any great extent. Modern conditions are now a goodly number of Liberals will undoubtedly vote against Allan Studholme, M.L.A., on account of his support of the war effort. As many of that party will cast their ballots for the labor member, rather than for the Conservative candidate.
