SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

A NY person who is the sole head of years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Mandtobe, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at eny agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties,—Six months' residence upon and outlivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, sole, younded and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, carghter brother or sister.

father, mother, son, caschter brother or sister.

In certain districts comesteader in good standing may gre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Dutles—mast reside upon the homestead or pre-imption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain district. Price \$3.00 per acre. Dutles—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.


