Lord's Day Alliance Having  
Less Recourse to Prosecution Now -- Annual Meeting on Friday.

One of the striking things that will be brought up at the meeting of the Ontario Lord's Day Alliance on Friday, will be the little recourse to the law during the past year, as compared with its efforts in its work of other years. So said Secretary Hanna, yesterday. Moral persuasion is now the force most employed.

The annual meeting will be held in the schoolroom of the Metropolitan Church, Friday next, starting at 10 a.m. The officers will be elected and the work of the year reviewed. Several matters of important interest, but not of startling moment, it is thought, will be presented and it is hoped that public concern will be manifested by a good attendance.

REJOICE JOHN McNEILL ACCEPTS.  
LONDON, Nov. 12. (C.A.P.)—Rev. John McNeill, of St. George's Presbyterian Church, Liverpool, has accepted the call to Cook's Church, Toronto. The decision was announced by the Liverpool Presbytery, the call being supported by Rev. Dr. Patterson, of Perth, formerly of Toronto. Mr. McNeill said that among the reasons affecting his acceptance was the fact that he had relatives in Canada, including a married daughter.

Many members of the presbytery voiced their regret at his departure. The resignation is effective Nov. 30.

Bequests Farm to Son.  
William Williamson, farmer, who died on the 10th of October, left an estate made up entirely of real estate, valued at \$4000.

By will, the deceased bequeathed the south half of the lot on the seventh concession, in the township of Markham (50 acres) to his son, Frank Williamson, subject to a life interest in favor of his wife and daughter, Berna. Frank gave the mortgage on the other half of the lot, he will also succeed to the second fifty acres.

SERIOUS RIOTS AT NEW ZEALAND.  
WAIHI, New Zealand, Nov. 12. (Can. Press.)—A riot broke out in the town of Waihi, New Zealand, today. Several persons were shot and killed and several others injured. The riot was caused by the taunts of strikers, a body of non-union workers marched to the union hall, burst open the door and rushed on the occupants. A fierce battle ensued, during which revolvers were freely used. Police rushed to the scene, but after the riot was quelled, a mob of "free workers" chased some strikers, severely beating them.

The strike at the Waihi gold mine has been in progress for some time. The men ask for better pay and shorter hours.

FENIAN RAID VETERANS DEAD.  
CORNWALL, Nov. 12. (Special.)—Cornwall lost two of her old residents in the deaths of John Galt, aged 65 years and 8 months, and James Denney, aged 80 years, the latter having been at Cornwall for many years.

Both were veterans of the Fenian raid of 1866 and 1870. Mr. Denney was one of those who organized the first Fenian club in Cornwall. For a great many years he was located as a tender of the bridge, which opens at the canal at this point.
