HAPPENINGS IN HAMILTON GOES FISHING; FOUND DEAD

Lawrence McCoy Succumbs From Asthma on the Street—Corpl. Briggs's Death.

Hamilton, May 29.—(Special)—The dead body of a man, afterwards identified as Lawrence McCoy, 214 North Emerald-street, was found lying on a vacant lot on Clark-avenue, this evening. He was about 70 years of age and had started out fishing this afternoon. Asthma is believed to have been the cause of a sudden death.

THE CANADIAN UNDERWRITERS' ASSOCIATION HAS ABOLISHED THE SURCHARGE ON 50 CENTS OF A HUNDRED DOLLARS IN INSURANCE.

The Canadian Underwriters' Association has abolished the surcharge of 50 cents of a hundred dollars in insurance, but it has re-rated the whole city placing each building on its own merits. The result is that while owners of dwellings will reap the benefit of the wiping out of the surcharge, the rates in the congested district have been boosted 25 cents a hundred, so that the decrease will be only half the amount of the surcharge.
