How the Town Was Laid Out.

The town site is laid off in streets, with two types of houses—large and small. The large ones were for men with large families, the smaller ones for the unmarried and families of two or three members.

Nobedy paid any rent. Every resident of the community, regardless of the character of his or her work, received equal compensation—the men who edited the paper and wrote lectures and books getting no more than the hewer of wood and drawer of water. As to women, the theory was that a woman who attended to her domestic duties rendered as much service to society as the man who labored, and so every housewife drew a salary.

After breakfast, at a fixed hour, each member of the colony went to his or her work under a particular superintendent. At noon dinner was served. At 2 p.m. work was resumed and continued until 5 p.m. Then the workers changed their dress to a holiday attire and spent the rest of the day in social and literary recreation, business meetings, etc."
