

LEASE OF CATTLE MARKET.

The privileges of collecting market fees and selling feed at the Western Cattle Mar-ket for 1903 were sold to the present lease, Daniel Atkinson, whose tender for the same was the highest of three submitted. For collecting fees \$20,860, and for selving feed, \$13,940, or a total of \$34,800. This is \$726 more than the next highest tender and \$2226 more than was paid for the present year.






