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OWEN'S BURGLAR FIGHT BEFORE ATTORNEY-GENERAL

Mr. Wood Asks to Have Suit Against Companies Brought Before Jury

Alfred Wood, proprietor of The Ottawa Free Press, appeared before Attorney-General Gibson yesterday morning and asked for a fiat to permit an indictment to be laid against certain insurance companies in Canada who had, it was claimed, committed a breach of section 520 of the Criminal Code...

JUDGE'S OPINION

Mr. Wood had endeavored to bring the case before the court, but Justice MacMahon in Ottawa decided that leave of the Attorney-General must be obtained first. For the insurers it was denied that any agreement had been made between the companies interested to fix rates, and it was claimed that the rate complained of was a fair rate. Mr. Wood's contention was that the question of fairness was one to be decided by a jury, upon a full presentation of the evidence, and that it was an injustice to him to have a matter decided upon incomplete and inaccurate statements in argument before the Attorney-General.

MR. MCCARTHY'S ARGUMENT

Mr. McCarthy then contended that the matter should be referred to a judge for decision whether the Attorney-General could issue such a fiat. Mr. McCarthy strongly argued that Mr. Wood should not be allowed to have independent companies in Ottawa who would not insure risks at less than the standard rate. Mr. Wood explained that the five companies outside the combine were young companies, and they might be eligible for membership in the union, but who, by strictly conforming to its rules, hoped to gain an admittance into the combine in the near future, profited by the association's actions.
