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Topics of Today.

The Dominion Tariff Commission will hear the farmer delegations immediately after the new year.
 Premier and Madame Laurier gave a dinner party in honor of Madame Albani at Ottawa on Saturday evening.
 A proclamation, after been issued, proroguing the Dominion Parliament pro forma to Tuesday, Jan. 26. Parliament is not likely to meet before the latter half of February.
 Mr. W. D. Lovitt, of Yarmouth, is to succeed the late Senator Kaibach in the Upper House. Mr. Lovitt was formerly a Liberal M. P. He is a leading ship owner, and has done much to develop trade with the West Indies.
 The New York Record recently ceased publication, after an existence of two years. Its proprietors had sunk nearly a million dollars in the vain attempt to build up a circulation, and the concern became bankrupt. In its last number the Record boasted that it had the largest circulation of any paper in New York.
 Hon. Mr. Tarte says that his department will not undertake a work of any importance without his personal knowledge of the undertaking. It is apparent that the Minister of Public Works comprehends what personal responsibility is.
 On Wednesday night next, Premier Greenway and Hon. Mr. Sifton leave Winnipeg for Ottawa to meet the Dominion Cabinet for the discussion of immigration plans.
 On Saturday next, a convention to choose a candidate to represent the Dominion by-election will be held at Brantford.
 Mr. D. Rolling, of St. Thomas, has visited the Gordon "coal" mine near Sudbury, Ont. A reporter interviewed him. Mr. Rolling is a typical York-shireman, and was employed for about twenty years coal mining in his native county. He does not merely think the Chelmsford deposit is coal, but is dead sure of it. We hope that his view will be generally sustained.
 Since July last the new Government have appointed seven senators. All the vacancies have now been filled.
 The Saskatchewan Dominion election will result in a Liberal being elected in any case. At the nomination on Saturday the candidates selected were two Liberals—Mr. T. O. Davis and Mr. J. R. McPhail. In last Parliament the district was represented by a Conservative.
 For the five months ended Nov. 30, the income of the Dominion this year was \$14,734,913, against \$14,954,142 for the same period last year. The expenditure is \$1,581,454.46, against \$1,783,941.73 for the like term of 1898. In the expenditure the following items are included: Extra summer session of Parliament, \$400,000; on account of militia camps, not in the year before, \$100,000; accounts accumulated in the Postoffice Department, which should have been paid the preceding year, \$150,000; or a total extraordinary expenditure of \$550,000. There is also a big payment for the new equipment of the militia.
 The Montreal Herald has ceased printing its morning edition, and will confine its attention to printing several day editions, after the example set by The Advertiser. The Herald management make the change in order to get at a wider circle of readers.
 ANOTHER GUSHER FOR BOTH—Bothwell, Dec. 12—Another big oil well has been struck. It is situated on the Johnson farm, and is pumping over 100 barrels per day.
