

Daymen Holds Two Records The High Freeline and Game

World's Trophy Score Smashed, After Being Held for Two Months - 663 is Now the Score to Beat.

Two records were broken last night that will no doubt stand for quite a while and the honor of both goes to Ernie Daymen, who was splitting the pins with a vengeance.
