CARRIAGE WOOD-WORK.—R. McKinley & Co., manufacture bent stuff for vehicles, hubs, spokes, &c. : they employ twelve men. This establishment was started in 1861.

CABINET WORK, &c.—McIntyre & Co., in this branch of industry, employ a large number of men and manufacture every description of furniture, bedsteads, chairs, &c.

SAW MANUFACTORY.—At J. Flint's establishment, situated on the canal, near the woollen factory, William A. Rawlings, managing, a large business is carried on, giving employment to ten hands, and turning out goods to the amount of \$44,000 per annum. The building is frame, and the machinery run by water.
