
PROVINCE OF ONTARIO.

**EXTRACTS FROM "AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE
REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS, DEATHS
AND MARRIAGES."**

(ASSENTED TO 23RD DECEMBER, 1875.)

Burials.

Every minister or other person who shall bury or perform any funeral or religious service for the burial of any dead body, unless he has received a certificate under the hand of the Registrar of the Division in which the death took place, according to schedule D to this Act annexed, that particulars of such death have been duly registered, shall make a return of such death according to schedule C, to this act Act annexed to the Registrar of the Division in which the death took place, within seven days of the burial.

Marriages.

Every clergyman, minister or other person authorized by law to celebrate marriages, shall be required to report each and every marriage he celebrates to the Registrar of the Division within which such marriage is celebrated, within ninety days from the date of such marriage, with the particulars required by schedule B, appended to this Act, and in order the better to enable the said clergyman, minister or other person to make such report as aforesaid, he shall be furnished by the Division Registrar of the Division in which he resides with blank forms, containing the particulars required by the said schedule B.

Penalty for Neglect of Duty.

For each and every offence, forfeit and pay a sum not less than one dollar, nor more than twenty dollars and costs, in the discretion of the presiding Justice before whom the case shall be heard.

The above came in force on the first day of January, 1876.
