

The St. John Board of Trade has received a copy of a report by a committee appointed by the Canadian Automobile Federation to investigate the increase in gasoline pricer. The committee can find no bette, reason for the increase than that it is due partly to supply and demand, and partly to trade conditions. Several suggestions are made, such as economy; the use of distillates for traction and such like engines; materists to endeavor to utilize heavy motor spirit, priming with high grade gasoline, inventors to find a kerosene practical carburetor, and the public to encourage increased production where oil exists.
