NEW PLANS TO AID LIVESTOCK TRADE

Former English Opponent of Canadian Cattle Pleased With Steers Shipped

OTTAWA, May 28.—Colonel H. A. Mullins (Conservative, Marquette) announced in the House that he has received a letter from Lord Bledisloe, Under Secretary of State for Agriculture in the British government, stating that he had received 100 Canadian steers and that he was very much pleased with them. Lord Bledisloe was formerly an enemy of the cattle trade. Colonel Mullins asked if the Minister of Agriculture or the Minister of Railways were doing everything to facilitate the transport of Canadian cattle.

LONDON DARKENED

Emergency Measures on Account of Strike Hit City's Night Life

LONDON, May 28.—A cloud of gloom has swept over Piccadilly and the other night life centres of London with the announcement of further fuel curtailment, owing to the miners' strike. All sky signs and decorative lighting are prohibited under the newest order of the Department of Mines, which is the most drastic since the war days. Coal supplies for factories are cut in half, householders will be allowed only 50 pounds weekly, and all street lighting will be reduced. The order is effective throughout the entire country.
