PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given by the City of Saint John that at a meeting of the Common Council thereof held on the Twelfth day of May A.D. 1913, the fol-lowing resolution was unanimously adopt-

the City of Saint John that at a meeting of the Common Council thereof held on the Twelfth day of May AD. 1913, the following resolution was unanimously adopted. "RESOLVED that the paving of that portion of German Street from King Street to Princess Street is necessary and that in the public interest such paving should be done; and further "RESOLVED that the Common Clerk publish a Notice of the passing of this resolution and also an estimate of approximate cost per lineal foot of such paving, as required under Section 1, Sub-section 1, Subthe paving of Streets in the City of Saint John."

AND in accordance with the provision of Section 1, Sub-section (b) of the Act 7 Edward VII., Chapter 87, notice is also hereby given that it is estimated that the approximate cost per lineal foot of such paving is \$14.80, and that the owners of the rateable land fronting on the sidewalks of said Street (or portion of Street), proposed to be paved, will be assessed and compelled to pay for the one-half of the cost of so paving such Street, viz.:—\$3.70 per lineal foot approximately for each owner's frontage on said Street; provided always that the said City will itself pay the cost of so paving the portions of the Street that includes such portions as cross another Street.

AND NOTICE is also hereby given that after the publication of this notice as required by the said Act, the City may proceed to perform the work of paving the Street (or portion of Street), mentioned in the said resolution unless within one month after such publication of this notice a petition against the same being done is presented to the City by the owners represented to the City by the owners represented to the real and rateable frontage on the sidewalk of said Streets or portion of Street), so proposed to be paved.




