MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

Chief Rideout of Moncton has notified
the police of St. John and Halifax to be
on the look-out for a man who has been
passing bogus cheques in Moncton and
Amherst.

The press and public of the west are
openly hostile to the issuing of \$100,000-
000 of new stock by the C. P. R. until re-
futations have been made in the freight
rates. They are trying to prevent the
dominion government from granting the
application until the rates conform with
those in the western states.

ceiving tenders for the Prince Edward Is-
land ferry which would have been in
yesterday. Several British and American
firms are figuring on the work.
