MONTREAL, Dec. 29—The annual statement of the Provincial Bank of Canada to be submitted to the shareholders at the meeting called for Feb. 3 will show liquid assets of \$26,398,685, as compared to \$20,940,160 for the preceding year, the percentage this year being 65 per cent of the total obligations to the public. Deposits and circulation are \$40,566,124, compared with \$38,064,765 for the previous year.

The total assets amount to \$45,219,594, against \$40,646,562 last year. Current loans and discounts in Canada and call and short loans on bonds, debentures, stocks, etc. give a total of \$26,179,999, as against \$23,495,717 last year.

SPRINGHILL HOUSE DESTROYED BY FIRE

Richard Brown Loses \$4,000

Home and Contents—All Uninsured

SPRINGHILL, N. S., Dec. 29—(Special)—The home of Richard Brown at Southbrook, about eight miles from here, was completely destroyed by fire early last night. So much headway had been gained by the fire before it was discovered that it was impossible to remove any of the furniture except a few chairs, even all personal belongings being lost. The loss will be well over \$4,000 with no insurance.

NEW YORK, Dec. 30—Frank Mc-Intyre, 80 years old, believed to be a resident of Boston, was credited by Captain John Gallagher and the detectives of the Hunters Point Precinct with having demonstrated an unusual method of attempting suicide.

The attempt was made in the barren wastes under the Queensboro Bridge in Long Island City late Christmas night. Somewhere McIntyre had got possession of a metal percussion cap to it in the same manner that blasters follow to set off a blast. At first he left the wires unjoined. Then he placed the cap on his forehead, pulled his hat down tight on the cap and completed the connection with the storage battery by bringing the two loose ends together.
