Following the example of other cities the tramway company has determined upon definite stopping places for the cars on the several routes. Cars will stop hereafter to take on or let off passengers only at the far side of street crossings, and at such points between streets as are noted by the sign "cars stop here." The object of this rule is to enable the cars to be run on time, and is in the interest of the patrons. The stopping places are as close to the street as possible, and it is hoped that at no place will passengers walking the cars have any distance to walk, while the gathering at a common point of passengers, instead of, as has been the custom, several people at intervals of a few yards apart, requiring the cars to stop, will greatly facilitate accuracy of time in running. It is hoped by the company that the public will assist in carrying out this object. The new time table issued by the company takes effect on Saturday.
