

OFFICERS ELECTED FOR ENSUING TERM

REGULAR MEETING OF CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

Secretary A. J. Morley Accepts Unanimous Invitation to Continue to Act—Other Business.

At Friday night's meeting of the chamber of commerce the officers for the ensuing three months were elected. Vice-President Carter occupied the chair in the absence of the president, J. L. Beckwith. The chairman asked for reports from committees.

On behalf of the committee appointed to look up suitable quarters for the association, Mr. Walker said that the committee had several plans in view, and asked for an extension of time to report. This was granted, the stipulation being made that the report be submitted at the next meeting.

Messrs. J. Nelson, R. B. Sealbrook, J. D. McNeven, Wm. Laird and G. M. Grogan made application for membership and were duly elected.

A new committee of four, Messrs. Church, Clements, Mowat and Townsend, was selected to complete the work of canvassing, having power to add to their number if necessary.

Stanley Tytton and A. B. McNeil applied for the position of secretary. Both communications were laid on the table. Phil Smith said that it would be several weeks before the transportation committee would be in a position to report. He thought some communications had been received by the committee which it would be well for the association to deal with.

The chairman asked if a partial report would be ready by next meeting. Mr. Smith replied that he would endeavor to have a part of the report ready.

W. R. Houston reported that the home industries' committee had appointed several additional members. The whole had been subdivided into five smaller committees, each being given special duties. It was hoped that a detailed report would be ready for the next meeting.

The executive committee recommended that a permanent secretary be appointed at a salary to be decided by the association as a whole, the appointee to devote only a portion of his time to the work.

The motion was carried. A. J. Morley read a number of applications for the position.

Mr. Kingham, second by W. J. Kingham, moved that Mr. Morley take office for the present, and that the association be a success someone who was vitally interested in the work should be appointed.

Mr. Morley made a few appropriate remarks, acknowledging the compliment paid him. He did not see how he could refuse the position if it was the unanimous wish of the meeting. In making this decision he felt that he was doing an unwilling injury to the applicants.

Mr. Morley was then formally elected. The nomination and election of a president and vice-president was the next business. G. Carter was proposed for the former position and elected unanimously. J. Kingham was nominated vice-president, and elected without a dissenting voice.

J. Forman, treasurer, wrote enclosing a statement of the financial standing of the association to date, which showed the chamber to be in a prosperous condition. He asked for a new treasurer to be appointed in his place.

Messrs. Church and Henderson were appointed auditors.

On motion Mr. Houston, the present treasurer, was requested to continue to act in that capacity.

Mr. Hanna moved that the executive be empowered to appoint a collector. Mr. Townsend strongly opposed such action. The matter was finally left in the hands of the executive.

Mr. Kingham gave notice that at the next meeting he will move that the association take immediate action towards incorporation.

The report of the members who had attended the meeting of the committees of the board of trade, city council, voters' league and chamber of commerce to discuss the appointment of harbor commissioners, was called for.

Mr. Kingham gave a report of the proceedings. In his opinion the meeting had only been called by the board of trade in order that the members of the chamber might be lectured. They were not given an opportunity to express their views and were treated most discourteously. He thought a vote of censure should be carried, severely condemning the action of the board of trade.

The chairman corroborated Mr. Kingham's statement by reading from newspaper reports of the Mayor appealing to the different committees for having called the meeting.

Mr. Houston did not think it was the place of the association as a whole to deal with the matter. It should be left in the hands of the members of the committee who deemed themselves aggrieved, to take what action they thought best.

The matter was finally left to the executive committee holding the next convention in the same fair city. RUMOR NOT TRUE.
Rev. Elliott S. Rowe, of Metropolitan Church, Will Not Enter Provincial Politics.

Rev. Elliott S. Rowe returned yesterday after an extended visit East. He came by way of the Sound reaching the city yesterday afternoon by the steamer Majestic.

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THE SELECTION OF A LIBRARY SITE

RATEPAYERS TO MAKE A CHOICE THIS WEEK

Consensus of Opinion Favors Lot on Corner of Yates and Blanchard Streets.

When the ratepayers almost unanimously accepted the Carnegie library offer it was not expected for one moment that the question would become such a burning one as it has. It has exhausted all the administrative talent of one council and agitated the present municipal legislative body to no little extent.

The plethoric debates, motions and amendments have simmered the question down to one of site selection, and a week from to-day the ratepayers will say whether they want the edifice erected on lot 1, block 70, the site opposite the post office, or the one on the corner of Yates and Yates streets.

The by-law to be submitted specifies these two sites, and it is up to the taxpayers to give their verdict.

The consensus of opinion among the citizens generally seems to be that the site on the corner of Yates and Blanchard is the more suitable. When its advantages were first enumerated it was found that it could not be acquired for less than \$7,500. Convinced that this was exactly the site that was wanted and being desirous of assisting liberally towards its purchase, a number of citizens offered to contribute sufficient to reduce the cost to the city to only \$4,500.

In view of its size, central situation and manifold advantages, this is what the small boy would call a "snap." The lot opposite the post office has its champions in the council, who have succeeded in having included in the estimates a sum to permit of the acquisition of a portion of the adjoining lot. Its advocates recognize that its present dimensions are wholly inadequate for the building which the citizens want.

A Times representative this morning sounded several prominent citizens on the subject. One of them said: "I think there is no comparison between the two sites. The Yates street site is admirably suited for such purposes. It is so central, yet convenient to all the car lines. From Pandora street it is but a minute and a half, from Fort street the same, and from Douglas street car line about two minutes' distance."

"A library does not require to be in the business centre of a community, but should be convenient to reach or easy of access. I understand that when the improvements now under way for the Fort street car tracks are completed the Esquimalt car will run through to Oak Bay, or the hospital; then see how easy it will be for residents of Victoria West to reach the library, provided it is placed on the corner of Yates and Blanchard streets. High school pupils from almost any part of the city, particularly Victoria West and Cook's estate, can reach Yates street without going a bit out of their way."

"When the post office was located where it is, everyone conceded it was a mistake, so on this occasion the people should awake from their usual indifference in matters of this kind and insist upon voting and placing the library (which has not the advantages of departmental letter boxes) in a central part of the city, and that, indeed, is the corner of Yates and Blanchard streets."
