## TIED TO TRACK FOR MOVING PHOTO, HE'S SLAIN BY TRAIN

Victim, Posing in Wrecking Scene, Struggles to be Free as Express Hits Him—Onlookers Faint.

CROYDON, near London, April 22.—Tied to a railroad track, to impersonate a signal man bound by robbers, in a moving picture representation of a train-wreck scene, William Zeltz, an actor, was ground to pieces by an express near here today.

As the train dashed over the prostrate form of the helpless man, bespattered with blood the photographers who in good faith had tied him down but a few moments before, two of those concerned fainted from the shock and had to be taken to a hospital. The others were arrested.

**THROUGH MISUNDERSTANDING.**

## SCIENTIST GETS STARFISH TO TURN SOMERSAULTS.

Teaches Marine Animals to Acquire Habit—Believes That Closer Training Would Bring Remarkable Results.

BALTIMORE, April 22.—A starfish has been trained to turn somersaults by Dr. Herbert S. Jennings, associate professor of physiology at Johns Hopkins University.

In fighting itself when turned on its back the starfish may use any pair from the five rays to attach itself and then, by pulling with this pair, it turns a somersault, returning to its natural position.

Training was directed towards getting the animal to perform regularly a certain pair of rays for this purpose, the experimenter at first not permitting it to use others. Professor Jennings, in a report in the university circular, states:

"By this method it was found that the starfish very readily acquires what may be called temporary habits. Thus in one typical case, in which the starfish was trained to use a certain pair of rays that were never used naturally after twelve lessons, one following the other immediately, the animal was

## LIONESS WAS SCARED AS MUCH AS PUBLIC

Terrorized by Small Boy Collides With Old Woman.

Ultimately Runs Up to Her Trainer and Trots Home by His Side.

PARIS, April 22.—An anaemic lioness who escaped from a menagerie at Reims yesterday has disgraced forever the magnificent traditions of her kind. She had been restive for some days, and when her keeper was stooping in the cage she gave him a gentle push, knocked him open and escaped through the open door. She was somewhat bewildered by her sudden liberty, and in her excitement made a dash for the market place, knocking down a small child on the way. The child, a particularly had-tempered youngster, picked itself up and three stones after her. This caused the lioness to hurry, and in her terror she came into collision with an old woman, who was knocked over by superior weight.

Then a brave young man appeared in the way and said "Shoo!" whereupon the lioness bolted down a side street, causing great consternation. She overtook a butcher's cart, and the butcher boy fled in terror, leaving his goods to the lioness, who stopped to enjoy a good round meal.

The butcher boy spread the alarm that an entire menagerie was loose in the streets. The timorous shut themselves up in the houses, but a few of the braver spirits determined for the first time to enjoy the delights of big-game hunting. They were led by an artilleryman with a drawn sword, and several peasants with rock rifles and pistols brought up the rear.

The lioness, having finished her meal, strolled into the market place, to the consternation of the women shoppers, who were quite unaware of her pacific intentions.

Her pursuers did not dare to go near her, but fired several ineffective shots from a distance. The Mayor then came on the scene, and pronounced the animal to be a particularly furious beast. He called out a squad of soldiers, and theory of Socialistic communism as their head, came up with the beast in a blind alley.

When the lioness saw her keeper she ran up to him and rubbed her head affectionately against him, before trotting home at his side.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 16, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Entry must be made personally, at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated.

The homesteader is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans:
