School Children to Wage War on Gypsy Moth in Province

"An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure" is apparently the mot to which is heid in the highest regard by the agricultural department of the provincial government and there is full evidence of this in the actions of the officials of that department. A demonstration of their foresight in carrying out a preventitive policy, is found in their recent action to guard the province from the Gipsy Moth, the most destructive of the destructive moth pests. Unlike the Brown Tail Moth, which is now causing the province much trouble, the Gipsy Moth Attacks the soft as well as the hard wood trees and is much more dangerous.

The department of Agriculture has distributed many circulars through the schools of New Brunswick with a view to have the children instructed in the dangers of the pest. 
