WILSON SURPRISED EVERYONE IN HIS PEACE REPLY

Wilson Surprised Everyone in His Peace Reply

Even His Military Associates Got the Unexpected—Allies Hardly Prepared For Staggering Rejoinder.

London, Oct. 20.—The President surprised all his military associates not to mention his enemies. Foch is considered the Sphinx one who keeps his plans to himself and starts his friends and foes by the suddenness of his blows.

The Allies were hardly prepared for the staggering reply to the German note. They feared the President was too moderate, that he would be caught in a trap and that he was assuming responsibility which they were entitled to share.

Wilson often is a puzzle to the veteran and the European statesman because he observes so few times established precedents surrounding statecraft. His handling of the first German note and the subsequent developments caused considerable irritation.


