**KILRUSH POLICE
FIRED UPON BY
SINN FEIN BAND**
Kilrush, Ireland, Jan. 20.—An en-
counter occurred near here today in
which a man supposed to be a Sinn
Fein was killed. While policemen
were removing their belongings from
the village of Coonacore to Knock in
a motor van they were fired on by a
large party from both sides of the
road. Four bicycle policemen return-
ed the fire, killing one man and cap-
turing two others of the attacking
party who were brought to Kilrush.
The body of the man killed fell into
the river and was swept away by the
current. The policemen escaped unin-
jured.
