Apple growing has made wonderful advancement in this favored section during the past-twenty-five years but there are very many acres well adapted to this purpose yet unoccupied. The Valley has ample room for many times the present population, and with an efficient immigration policy and a reasonable amount of encouragement to our own people on the part of the powers that be, would enter upon an era of prosperity little dreamed of by the early settlers.
