brance of the sacrifice of His death, as he himself hath commanded; which if ye shall neglect to do, consider with yourselves how great is your ingratitude to God, and how sore punishment hangeth over your heads for the same, when ye will fully abstain from the Lord's Table, and separate from your brethren who come to feed on the banquet of that most heavenly food."—Church Life.
