loving Subjects whom these prefents may concern. WHEREAS in purfuance of an Ad of Parliament lately made and provided, paffed in the Thirty first Year of Our Reign and of Authority by Us given for that purpole, our late Province of Quebec is become divided into the two Provinces of Upper Canada and Lower Canada, and Our Lieutenant Governor of the faid Province of Lower Canada by Power from Us derived, is authorized in the ablence of Our Right Trufty and Well beloved Guy LORD DORCHESTER, Cap. tain General and Governor in Chief of Our faid Province of Lower Canada to divide the faid Province of Lower Canada into Diffricts, Counties, Circles or Towns and Townfhips for the purpole of effectuating the intent of the faid Act of Parliament, and to declare and appoint the number of Representatives to be chosen by each to serve in the Affembly of the faid Province. KNOW YE THEREFORE, that Our Trufty and Well beloved ALURED CLARKE, Our Lieutenant Covernor of Our faid Province of Lower Canada, in the absence of Our faid Governor in Chief, hath and by this Our Proclama. tion doth divide the faid Province of Lower Canada into Counties, Cities and Towns, and declare and appoint the number of the Representatives of them and each of them to be as herein after limited, named, declared and appointed, that is to fay, that the firlt of the faid Counties be all that part of the faid Province on the Southerly fide of the River of St. Lawrence, now called the Diftrict of Gaspé, as described in Our Royal Proclamation under the Great Seal of Our late Province of Quebec, bearing date the twenty fourth day of July in the twenty-eighth year of Our Reign; and that the lecond of the laid Counties to be called Cornwallis, fhall comprehend all that part of Our faid Province on the same fide of the River St. Lawrence between the said County of Gaspé and a line running South east from the westerly angle of a tract of land commonly called the Seignior of M. Lauchlan Smith or S. Ann's, together with the Islands of St. Barnaby and Bucant all other Islands in the faid River nearest to the faid County, and in the whole or " part fronting the fame; and that the third of the faid Counties to be called Devon shall comprehend all that part of Our faid Province on the fame fide of the faid River of St Lawrence between the westerly fide of the faid County of Cornwallis and a line paralle thereto running from the wefterly angle of a tract of land commonly called the Seignior, of the River du Sud, together with all the Illands in the River St. Lawrence neareflut the faid County, and in the whole or in part fronting the fame; and that the fourth of the faid Counties to be called Hertford, shall comprehend all that part of Our faid Province on the southerly fide of the River St. Lawrence between the westerly fide of the fait County of Devon and a line parallel thereto, running from the northeafterly angle of: tract of land commonly called the Seigniory of Lauzon or the Seigniory of Point Lev, together with all the Islands in the faid River St. Lawrence nearest to the faid County, and in the whole or in part fronting the fame; and that the fifth of the faid Counties to be cal led Dorchefter fhall comprehend all that part of Oar faid Province on the foutherly lide of the faid River St. Lawrence, between the westerly fide of the faid County of Hertfort and a line parallel thereto, running from the wafterly angle of the afore faid tract of law called the Seigniory of Lauzon or the Seigniory of Pointe Levy, together with all the Islands in the faid River St. Lawrence nearest to the faid County, and in the whole or part fronting the fame; and that the fixth of the faid Counties to be called Buckingham fhire, fhall comprehend all that part of Our (and Province on the foutherly inde of th faid River St. Lawrence between the westerly fide of the faid County of Dorchester an a line parallel thereto, running from the northeafterly angle of a tract of land common called the Seigniory of Sorel, together with all the Iflands in the laid River Lawren
