PROWSE, SAMUEL. (Kings, 4th Dist.)

Returned at last g.e. 1876. Apptd. to Ex. Council 1876, upon formation of new Govt. Resigned his seat in Ex. Council 1878.

RICHARD, JAMES WILLIAM. (Prince, 2nd Dist.]

B. at Swansea, in Wales, 31 May, 1850. Ed. at Prince of Wales' and St. Dunstan's College, Charlottetown. Unmarried. First returned to Parlt. for present seat Oct. 1873, on resignation of sitting member. Again re-elected by acclamation 1876. A Conservative.—Bideford.

ROBERTSON, Hon. JAMES EDWIN, M.D., C.M. [Kings, 4th Dist]

Parents emigrated from Perthsbire, Scot. to P.E.I. about 1818. Descended from the Robertsons of Foss, Perthshire. B. in New Perth, P.E.I. Ed. at McGill University, Montreal. M. at Charlottetown, P.E.I. 11 Nov. 1878, Elizabeth McFarlane, eld. dau. of James McFarlane, Esq. of Souris, P.E.I. Returned for the 4th Dist of Kings County for the Local House of P.E.I. in 1870, by acclamation, when the Conservative Govt. was defeated the following session; was again returned by acclamation, and was a member of the Haythorne Govt. till P.E.I. joined the Dominion. Did not offer in the election of 1873; was again returned for the same district in 1876. Is a free school candidate, and is now a member of the Free School Govt. of P.E.I. A Liberal, in favor of free-trade principles.—Montagu.
