fing this Act, to 25 Dec. 1770, &c.

Whale Fins, taken from Whales caught by British Sub-jects in the Gulph or River of Saint Lawrence, or on the Corits of the British Colonies, may be imported in British Ships, duly navigated,

paying no other Duty, than the Old Subfidy grant-ed by Act 25 Car. II;

the Master first making Oath, at the Port of Importation, of the Truth of the Premisses.

Cessions made by the late Peace, most humbly beseech From the pas- Pour Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enact= ed by the King's most Excellent Wajesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Tempotal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful to and for any Person or Persons, from and after the palling of this Aft, at any Time before the Twenty fifth Day of December, One thousand seven hundled and seventy, and from thence to the End of the then next Section of Parliament, to import in Ships belonging to His Hajesty's Subjects (whereof the Caytain of Master, and Three Fourth Parts of the Mariners. are his Hajesty's Subjects) Whale Fins taken from Whales caught by any of His Wajeap's Subjects in the Gulph of River of Saint Lawrence, of in any Seas on the Coasts of any of his Wajesty's Colonies in America, without paying any Custom, Subsidy, or Duty, for the same, other than and except the Rate or Duty commonly called The Old Subfidy, granted by an Aft made in the Twenty fifth Bear of the Reign of King Charles the Second, intituled, An Act for the Encouragement of the Greenland and Eastland Trades, and for the better securing the Plantation Trade, for and during the said Terms; any Law oz Statute to the contrary thereof notwithstanding.

Provided always, and be it enacted by the Authority afozesaid, That nothing in this Act contained shall ertend, or be confirmed to extend, to allow the Importation of Mhale Fins without paying any Custom, Subsidy, of Duty, other than and except the said Rate of Duty commonly called The Old Sublidy, unless the Captain, Hafter, or other Commanding Officer of the Ship or Clessel, or the Person importing the same, chall first make Dath before One of the Principal Officers of the Customs in the Port or Ports of Importation (who is and are hereby authorized and required to administer such Dath) that all the Whale Kins imported in such Ship or Aestel were, to the best of his knowlege and Belief, really and bona fide the Fins of Whales caught and taken in the Gulph of River of Saint Lawrence, of in the Seas on the Coalis of some of his Majesty's Colonies in America, by the Crew of such Ships and Clesfels only, whereof the Owner of Owners, the Captain or Walter, and Three Fourth Parts of the Mariners, were his Majedy's Subjects.
