This is a Liberal Riding which has been lost through internal dissensions in the party. Dr.Dewar is still regarded a strong candidate.

ESSEX SOUTH August 13th, 1912.

Organizer Adams reports " I conferred with the following viz:- President C.E.Naylor, of Essex, Secretary Wright of Leamington, William Fleming, Vice Chairman for Kingsville, Ed Winter, Leamington, Charles Clark and Arthur Ferris, both of Harrow Town, R.R. Brett, Essex, late Provincial candidate, John A.Auld ex M.P.P., and A.H. Marsh both of Amherstburg. The following lists are posted viz; Tilbury North, Colchester North and South. Kingsville and Essex Town, and Anderdon Township. Mr. Brett is personally looking after Essex Town ( assisted by others ) Colchester North and Gosfield North when it comes out. On August 2nd an Executive meeting at Essex raised \$350 to provide for the work of revision. They have been unable to secure a good man so far, but are in hope of inducing Arthur Alga of Harrow an Insurance Agent to take up the work.
