Revives view of purpose to destroy present Gov't.

Macdonald Government and India Round Table Conference - a contrast.

Resentment created.

Contrast feeling Dunning budget versus this.

Feeling interrupted by Ferguson's statements:

(1) Not going to sell wheat

(2) Marketing of Empire goods.

Canada's prestige lower.

Canada lost for time being change to expand market.

Relations between present governments strained.

Canada's present gov't under suspictions.

Relations between several nations of Commonwealth more difficult.

Canada's rivals in British market gained strong position.

Argentine - compare (1) if Dunning budget carried (2) what witnessed in other ways.

Russia - Bennett's action.

Canada unable to negotiate trade agreement with any government unless position changed.

Ottawa Conference doomed unless policies changed.
