Sir,-

I beg to inform you that a communication has been received from Mr. Hennessy, Veterinary Surgeon, who states that he has been notified to leave the Six Nations reserve unless he procures the requisite authority or permission from the Department. He states that he has lived constantly on the reserve for the past 14 years, and has never been molested or interfered with, and there has never been any complaint against him, and I have to request that you will report fully in this matter, advising as to when Mr. Hennessy entered on the reserve and under what authority, and why he has been allowed to remain so long on the reserve without permission, and full facts in connection with the matter so that the Department may be able to arrive at a decision as to his removal.
